



The above described piece of Land was originally a part of Isaiah Jennings's land but was Surveyed off the request of George Yeagle who became vested with an interest in said piece of Land. The Survey was made on the 21<sup>st</sup> day of May 1800 and contains as above Eight Acres and  $\frac{1}{13}$  perches and 20 rods and 20 poles of land and is situated in Mahanoy Township of Franklin County and is situated in Mahanoy Township of Franklin County. The Warrant of Isaiah Jennings was dated 5<sup>th</sup> of April 1765 No 157 for 250 acres of which there was Surveyed & Retained 245 Acs 49 perches & all.
