



Pursuant to the Proprietary's Warrant Dated the ^{*} fifth Day of May Anno Dom. 1736 and according to the Direction of Benjamin Eastburn Surveyor General of the Province of Pennsylvania I have surveyed and laid out a Tract of Land for Daniel Williamson of Chester County Yeoman - Situate upon a Branch of Schuylkill called Plum Creek in Lancaster County Beginning at a White Oak on ^e South Side of the said Branch then North Twenty Degrees East one Hundred & Fifty Seven perches to a Post then South Seventy Degrees East One Hundred Thirty Eight Perches to a Post thence North Twenty Degrees East Sixty Perches to a Post thence South Seventy Degrees East Seventy Seven Perches to a Post then South ~~Twenty~~ ^{Twenty} Degrees West one Hundred & forty four Perches to a Post thence North Eighty ^{Seven} ~~& three quarters of a degree~~ Degrees West two Hundred & Twenty ~~six~~ ^{three} perches to the Place of Beginning Containing One Hundred and Ninety Acres ^{as} & ~~a~~ ^{three} quarters including Allowance &c or 180 & Allowance surveyed ^{as} the 8th day of the 3^d month May 1739 P.
