



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Hoaccony Township in the County of Northampton (or formerly Bucks) in the State of Pennsylvania, Containing Sixty Two Acres, and 100 Perches of Land together with the usual allowance at six per Cent for Roads. That formerly was Surveyed by Edward Scull for Michael Rishel By Virtue of a Warrant from the Honourable Proprietaries Dated on the 2^d Day of March anno 1749 → The Heirs of the said Michael Rishel deceased afterwards sold their Right to the same to George Shroyer who again in the year 1773 sold and Conveyed the same to the Revd Jacob Van Buskirk →

The said Tract was Desurveyed on the 25th October 1771 and now drawn for the said Jacob Van Buskirk By Order of the Surveyor General January 12th anno 1782
