



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Honorable Proprietaries bearing Date the Twenty fifth Day of March (Dorm) 1738 I have Surveyed & Laid out unto John Young in the Township of Pennsborough in the County of Lancaster on the West side of Susquehanna River Two Hundred and Thirteen acres of Land with allowance of six 1/2 Cent Beginning at an Elm Tree standing by Conecoga Creek then West one Hundred and forty five perches to a white oak a corner of Robert Gilkisons Land thence by the same Land South Ninety five perches to a white Oak thence East West forty four perches to a Walnut thence South fifteen Degrees West by Seventy seven perches to a Red Oak a corner of James Youngs Land thence East one hundred ninety nine perches and three quarters to a Post another corner thence North Seventy two perches to a white Oak thence North East Seventy five perches to a Hickory by the sd Creek then up the same Travelling the severall Courses thereof near about Eighty perches to the place of Beginning
