



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the 2nd Day of December Anno Domini 1737. The above described Tract of Land was Surveyed unto Henry Deiler on the Branches of North Creek near the Mountain in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a White Oak Thence South 67 degrees West by Leonard Road 26 perches to a Black Oak. Thence South 10 degrees East by Vacant Land 150 pches to a White Oak. Thence North 80 degrees East by Vacant Land 163 pches to a post, Thence North 15 degrees East by another tract of the said Road 164 perches to a Hickory. Thence North 75 degrees West by Vacant Land 177 pches to a post. Thence South 10 Degrees East by the first mentioned Tract of the said Leonard Road 68 perches to a post. Thence South 80 Degrees West by the same 44 perches to the place of Beginning. Containing Two Hundred and Twelve acres Beside allowance of Six per Cent.
