

A Draught of a Tract of Land known by the name of the Chestnut Land, situated on the West side of the Cheat Creek where the path from Frankstown to the Kittanning crosses the said Creek adjoining Lands of John Hammur in the County of Bedford Containing two hundred and eighty six acres one quarter of an acre and the usual allowance of six rods for Roads &c Surveyed the 21<sup>st</sup> day of June 1773 for Abiah Taylor in pursuance of a warrant Dated the 25<sup>th</sup> day of May in the same year 1773

N.B. That part of the Land mentioned in the above warrant which lies on the S or E side of Cheat Creek was surveyed & returned in 1769 for Alexr. 17<sup>th</sup> Caustland over an order No 1370 dated April 3<sup>d</sup> 1769.
