



By virtue of a warrant dated the 8<sup>th</sup> September 1806 Surveyed  
the 16<sup>th</sup> May 1807 to Henry

Miller the above described tract of land situated in Moore and Barnfield Townships Northampton County  
containing one hundred and forty eight acres and the allowance of sixty Cent &c. The whole of  
the above described tract is claimed by Walter Miller Esq; the piece marked B Surveyed by James  
Dodd late Deja Surveyor and Walter Miller saith on his application he also claims the im-  
provement thereon. The piece marked B on a warrant dated the 1<sup>st</sup> April 1786 returned in  
Surveyor's Office the 20<sup>th</sup> May 1789 and the piece marked C on a warrant dated the 5<sup>th</sup> April  
1790 returned in Surveyor's Office the 2<sup>nd</sup> May 1792. The buildings are all on the piece marked  
B. The clear lands extend to all the three tracts. Henry Miller alleges the piece marked B was  
surveyed without any Right & he claims the improvement of all the lands
