 By virtue of a warrant dated the 8th September 1806 surveyed the 16 May 1807 to Henry Miller the above described tract of land situate in Moore and Rainfield Townships Northampton County containing one hundred and forty eight acres and the allowance of six yo Cent &c^{rs}. The whole of the above described tract is claimed by Walter Miller viz, the piece marked A surveyed by James Douie late Dep Surveyor, and Walter Miller saith in said Application, he also claims the improvement thereon. The piece marked B, on a warrant dated the 7th April 1786 returned in Surv^r Gen Office the 20 May 1789, and the piece marked C, on a warrant dated the 5 April 1790, returned in Surv^r Gen Office the 2 May 1792. The buildings are all on the piece marked A. The clear lands extend to all the three tracts. Henry Miller alleges the piece marked A was surveyed without any Right &c he claims the improvement of all the lands
