



Situate in Hopewell Township in the County of York, surveyed on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of July AD<sup>o</sup> 1804. In Pursuance of a Warrant for 32<sup>a</sup> Granted to Hugh Hooddy bearing date the 25<sup>th</sup> day of March 1804. - We further beg leave to represent that the Widow Diegel or Shagley Claims the whole of the above described Land (and is in the actual Possession thereof about 9<sup>a</sup> whereof is cleared as above set forth) In Pursuance of a Warrant for 50<sup>a</sup> Granted to Jacob Diegle, dated the 10<sup>th</sup> day of August AD<sup>o</sup> 1766. Originally surveyed by William Keesey late D.S. on the 12<sup>th</sup> of the 5<sup>th</sup> mo AD. 1794, and by his draught said to contain 41<sup>a</sup> & 96<sup>ps</sup> and allowance including the Black as well as the dotted lines above set forth and which appears to have been returned into the Surveyor General's office about nine or ten years ago.
