To Ash up the Creek

Site joining Stony Creek in Shamong Township New Somerset County and surveyed the 19th day of October 1776 by George Woods Esq. late D.S. as appears by his Official Draft remaining in my Office in pursuance of a warrant granted unto Peter Dishong for 300a dated the 5th day of August 1776 - and Certified the 8th day of January 1805 to Samuel Cochran Esquire

 Note this survey is wholly disputed by George Michael Amber on his ^{Improvement} & Warrant for 200a dated the 15th day of August 1793 and Philip ^{Croyle} Warrant for 200a dated 15th August 1793 and perhaps others, as I was not permitted to trace the lines I cannot describe the interferences with other surveys I went at the Request of Mr. Goodman to retrace the lines if I could find a Draught of the same which I found in the Commissioners Office and after a tedious search on the ground found the Hickory Corner. At that had my Chain stretched ~~over~~ to start and two Men belonging to the parties seized my Chain and had to quit &c - S.C.S.S.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this 7th day of November 1898.
