



The foregoing is a draft &c. of the courses of Joseph Pennock who claims on a warrant in the name of John Bryon for 50 acres as dated the 15th day of July 1773. This land was once surveyed on Virginia Certificate being part of a proportion (439 3/4) of 1000 acres and so returned but I believe not accepted at the Land office it is now (1832) Surveyed and returned in S^d Warrant that Pennock may obtain a patent for it with his other adjoining land (66 2/3). The land is situated on the head ~~land~~ waters of Lick Run in Union Township Dauphin County and is nearly all cleared and has been in a state of cultivation for many years.

I believe the return of this land on the Virginia certificate to Thomas M^r Christopher did not accept it and was directed to make other returns of the land on the location of Warrant to Bryon this being the oldest right.
