



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the third day of April Anno Domini 1735. The above described Tract of Land was Surveyed unto David Evans in the Township of Chedoke in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a post in Christian Stetter line ^{There} West along the same 88 perches to a White Oak. Thence South 48 degrees West by the said Stetter 84 perches to a White Oak. Thence West Nor. West by Vacant Land 50 perches to a post. Thence North East by North by the settlement of Jacob Leisher 150 perches to a White Oak. Thence North 73 degrees East by a Stony Hill 84 perches to a Black Oak. Thence South South East by the Improvement or Claim of Ulrich Sherk 32 perches to a Black Oak. Thence South 5 degrees East by the same 96 perches to a Hickory. Thence South 15 degrees East by the same 21 perches to 4th place of Beginning. Containing One hundred acres Beside 4th usual allowance.
