



By virtue of a warrant from the proprietaries Dated the fourteenth day of March 1733. Surveyed to Henry Heazleton a certain tract of land situate in Plumsted Township in the County of Bucks. Beginning at a corner stone of George Fitzwaters's Land thence by the same South East two hundred & sixty six perches to a post thence by Vac<sup>t</sup> land South West one hundred and forty one perches to a post thence by Vacant land and land belonging to the heirs of William Wilkinson. Dada North West two hundred and sixty six perches to a post thence by Vac<sup>t</sup> land North East one hundred and forty one perches to y<sup>e</sup> place of Beginning. Containing two hundred and twenty <sup>one</sup> <sup>823 1/2</sup> acres, w<sup>th</sup> usual allowances of six q<sup>rs</sup>. ct.
