



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the second day of September 1734 Surveyed unto Thomas Hammond a tract of Land situate in New-Cowisickopen in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup>. Beginning at a post a corner of a tract laid out to Mary Leacock thence by the same South West one hundred and ten perches to a post, thence by S. Leacock South East twenty three perches to a post thence by land laid out to Christopher Smith South West one hundred perches to a post, thence by land laid out to George March North West one hundred & fifteen perches to a White Oak, thence by Vacant Land North East two hundred and ten perches to a post, thence by Vac<sup>t</sup> Land South East ninety perches to a place of Beginning Containing One Hundred and Twenty five acres with a usual allowance of six p<sup>ts</sup> Cent.
