



Duly surveyed on the 3^d day of April 1734 to George Hargan a certain Tract of Land situate in New Cowesakoyock in the County of Philadelphia. Beginning at a post a Corner of George Wegars Land hence by the same North forty degrees East one hundred & fifty perches to a post a Corner of said Wegars land hence by land of Jacob Fisher & Vacant Land North fifty degrees West one hundred & thirteen perches to a post. Hence by Vacant Land South forty degrees West one hundred & fifty perches to a small Hickory sapling on the line of the Mannor of John Penn Esq^r. Hence by the same South fifty degrees East one hundred & thirteen perches to a place of Beginning Containing One hundred acres with usual allowance.
