



In pursuance of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the sixteenth day of September A.D. 1735. Surveyed unto Leonard Holston a certain tract of Land situate in the County of Lancaster on a Branch of Mill Creek, which is also, a branch of Turpehocken Creek, Beginning at a post at a Corner of David Evans's Land thence extend<sup>g</sup> by the same land on a settlement of Ludwick Plum North North West two hundred and twelve yokes to a White Oak marked thence by the same settlement and vacant Land West South West one hundred and forty yokes to a Post, thence by Vacant Land South South East one hundred and six yokes West South West forty yokes to a post. South South East one hundred and six yokes to a post and East North East one hundred and eighty yokes to the place of Beginning. Containing two hundred acres and the usual allowance for Roads &c. Surveyed the 10<sup>th</sup> Day of October Anno Domini 1735.
