



By Virtue of a warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing date the Twenty first Day of February Anno Dom/1737 I have survey'd and laid out unto Richard Gulton in the Townships of Pennsborough in the County of Lancaster on the West side Susquehanna River Two hundred and sixty three Acres of Land with allowance of 6% Cent.

Beginning at a White Oak standing one the side of Fishing Creek thence North sixteen Degrees Westerly Forty two perches and a half to a Post in the line of George Hall's Land then by the same Land South seventy Degrees Easterly Thirty perches to a Post thence north Twenty Degrees Easterly Two hundred and eighty five perches to a Hickery thence South fifty two Degrees Easterly one hundred and forty perches to a Hickery thence South Twenty Degrees Easterly Three hundred and forty one perches to a White Oak by the s^d Creek then up the same Traversing the severall Courses thereof near about Two hundred and fifty perches to the place of
