



By Virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated  
the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of December anno Domini 1737 Surveyed on  
the 10<sup>th</sup> day of January 1737 To John Calwall a Tract  
of Land Situate in the Township of Paxton in the County  
of Lancaster; Beginning at a white oak Standing by Beaver  
Creek Thence North 62° Degrees West 166 perches to a white oak,  
Thence South 28° Degrees West 145 perches to a white oak Thence  
South 62° Degrees East 176 perches to a white oak Standing the  
said Creek - Thence up the said Creek by its several Courses 172 per-  
ches to the place of beginning containing 150 acres and the allow-  
ance of six acres per Acre for Roads and high Ways.
