



By Virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 22<sup>o</sup> day of December Anno Dom. 1737 Surveyed on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of January 1737 To John Calwell a Tract of Land Situate in the Township of Paxton in the County of Lancaster; Beginning at a white oak standing by Beaver Creek Thence North 62° Degrees West 166 perches to a white oak Thence South 28° Degrees West 145 perches to a white oak Thence South 62° Degrees East 176 perches to a white oak standing the said Creek - Thence up the said Creek by its several courses 172 perches to the place of beginning containing 150 acres and the allowance of six acres p cent for Roads and high Ways.
