



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing Date the 29th Day of November Anno Domini 1737. I have surveyd & laid out unto Thomas Doyle in the Tuscarora Gap in the County of Lancaster^{sh} on the West side Susquehanna River five hundred and Thirty acres of Land with allowance of Six p Cent. Beginning at a Black Oak Thence North Thirty five Degrees Westerly Three hundred and Twenty two perches to a White Oak Thence North fifty five Degrees Easterly Three hundred and Twenty pches to a White Oak Thence South Thirty five Degrees Easterly Two hundred and forty pches to a Chestnut Oak Thence South forty Degrees and forty minutes Westerly Three hundred and Thirty pches and a half to the place of Beginning - Surveyd Decem^r 20th 1737
