



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Honble Proprietaries bearing date the second Day of August Anno 1735 I have surveyd and laid out unto Andrew McClery in the Town of Lancaster on the West side Susquehanna river Three hundred and eighty eight Acres of Land with allowance of six P Cent Beginning at a Sycamore Tree standing at the mouth of a small run by Conechochee Creek up the sd run about fifty six perches to a black haw bush Thence North sixty five Degrees Westerly Sixty perches to a Hickory Thence South Twenty five Degrees Westerly Two hundred forty four perches to a Black oak Thence South sixty five ^{deg} Easterly one hundred and forty three perches to a White Oak by the sd Creek then up the same Traversing the severall Courses thereof Near about six hundred perches to the place of Beginning
