



By Virtue of a warrant from the Honble Proprietaries bearing date the six day of October Anno 1738 I have surveyed and laid out unto John McGarlan on the branches of Marsh Creek on the west side Susquehanna river in the County of Lancaster two hundred and twenty five acres of Land with allowance of six p Cent Beginning at a White oak a Cornr of Robt McGarsons Land Thence North Twenty two Degrees Easterly one hundred and eighty perches to a Swamp oak a Corner of John Thompsons Land Thence North sixty eight Degrees westerly Two hundred & twelve perches to a hickery Then South Twenty two westerly on hundred and eighty perches to a Post a Corner of the sd McGarsons Land by the same land South Sixty eight Degrees Easterly Two hundred and twelve perches to the place of Beginning Survey'd June 7th 1739
