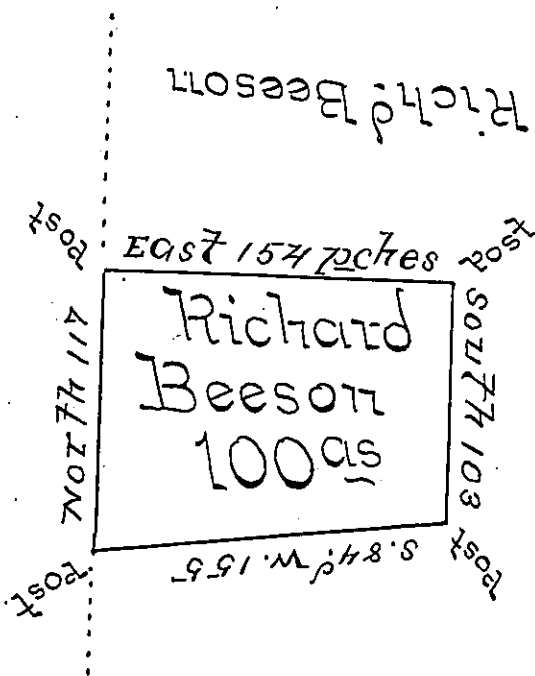

By Warrant from the Proprietaries of the 16th of January 1733 Surveyd to Rich^d Beeson on the 19th of same Month A Tract of Land Situate in Leacock Township in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a Post at a corner of s^d Beeson's other Land thence East by the same 154 pches to a post thence South 103 pches to a post, thence South 84^o West 155 p to a post thence North by Edw^d Woodward's Land 117 pches to the place of Beginning Containing one Hundred Acres and the Usual allowance for Roads
