



Situate on the East side of Laurel Hill on both sides of the Pennsylvania road & on the Waters of Quemahoning Creek including a Spring, said to be in Westmoreland County, but truly found to be in Jenner Township Somerset County late Bedford, & Surveyed by John Wells Esq. late deputy Surveyor the 29<sup>th</sup> day of September 1795. In pursuance of a Warrant dated the 19<sup>th</sup> day of December 1786 for 100 acres, as appears by the Official Draught & Certificate of John McClean Esq. D.S. dated 26<sup>th</sup> Nov<sup>r</sup> 1812 - & Certified & returned this 16<sup>th</sup> day of Jan<sup>y</sup>. A.D. 1832
