



By Virtue of a Warrant from y^e Proprietor Dated y^e 2nd 5^{mo} Anno Domini 1738 the above Described Tract of Land was surveyed unto John Dickson, In y^e Township of Hanover in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a White Oak by Swataworo Creek. Then up the same on the several courses thereof 296 perches to a Birch Tree. Thence West by a line of trees 144 perches to a White Oak. Thence South 61 degrees West by the Improvement of Walter Caruth, 84 perches to a White Oak. Thence South 7 degrees West by George Colborn, s Improvement 52 perches to a White Oak. Thence South 5 degrees East by the same 98 perches to a White Oak. Thence South 58 degrees East by the Land of William Harrison & Vacant Land 160 perches to the place of Beginning. Containing Two Hundred & seventy four acres besides the allowance of six p^{er} cent.
