



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the 2^d day of December Anno Dom. 1734. The above Described Tract of Land was surveyed unto John Douglas in the Township of Sadsbury in Lancaster County. Beginning at a Maple by a branch of Octoraro Creek. Then up the same on its several courses 190 perches to a White Oak then North 53 deg East by Andrew McLevain 160 p to a poplar in a line of Alexander Work. Thence South 61 deg East along the same 17 perches to a Hickory Thence East by the s^d Works land 60 per to a Chestnut Oak Thence South 24 degrees East by the same 100 perches to a post in the line of William Perry. Thence South 50 deg West by the same land 28 perches to a Black Oak Thence South 62 degrees West by John Thomson Junior 98 perches to an Ash. Thence South 40 degrees West by the same land 126 per. to y^e place of Beginning Containing One hundred & ninety seven acres beside the allowance of six p^{er} s.
