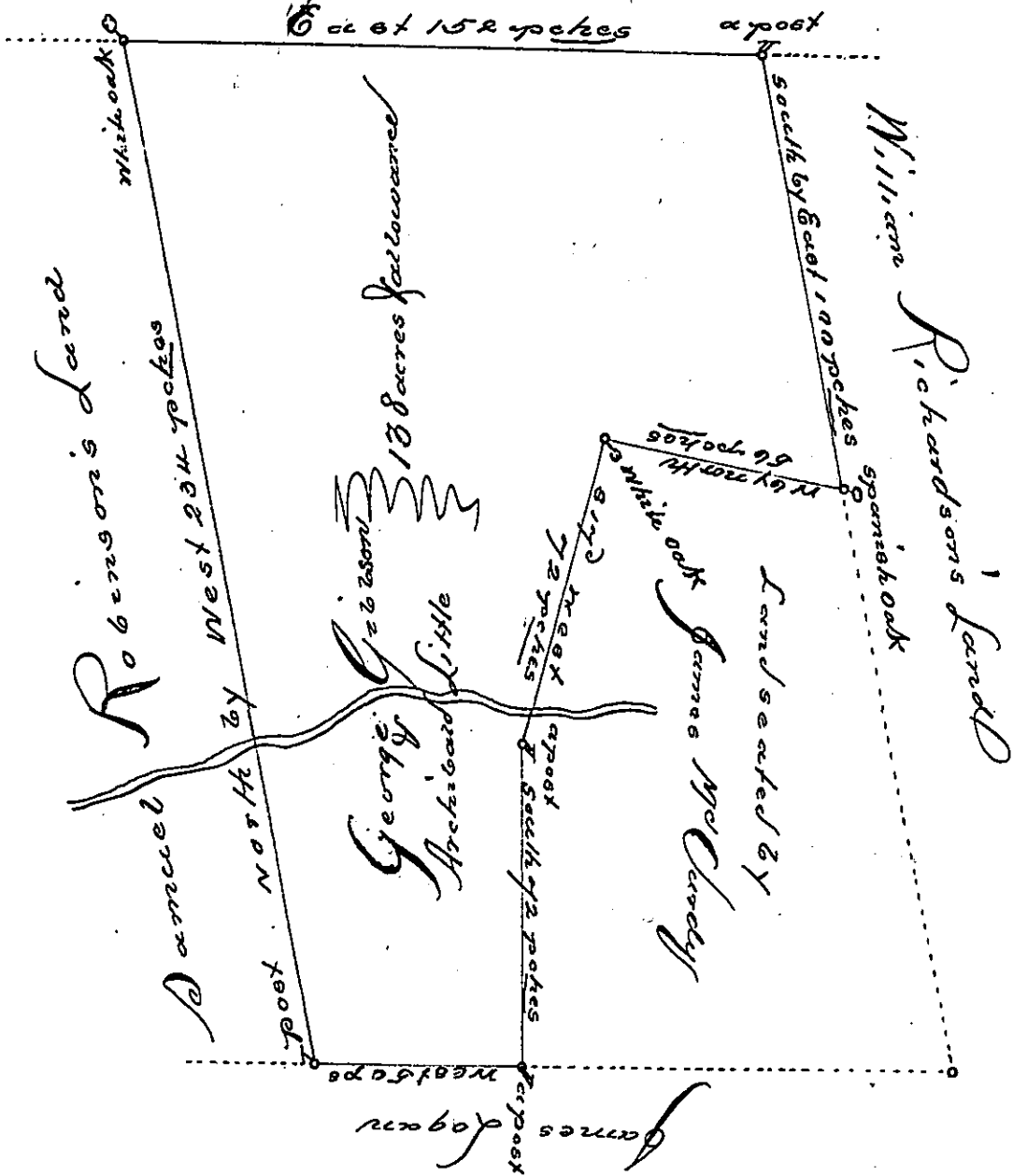


James Varners Land
