



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the thirteenth day of August 1734 Surveyed unto Andreas Fisher a tract of Land Situate in Mapestown in the County of Philada. Beginning at a Black Oak in a line of Henry Harpman's land thence by the same South Ten degrees East one hundred and Six perches to a White Oak Sapling thence by the sd. Harpman's land North Eighty degrees East one hundred and Eight perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South ten degrees East Eighty Seven perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South Eighty degrees West two hundred and thirty five perches to a post thence by land laid out to William Gross North ten degrees west one hundred and Ninety three perches to a post thence by Vacant land North Eighty degrees East one hundred and twenty seven perches to y<sup>e</sup> place of Beginning Containing two hundred acres with y<sup>e</sup> usual allowance of Six pCent.
