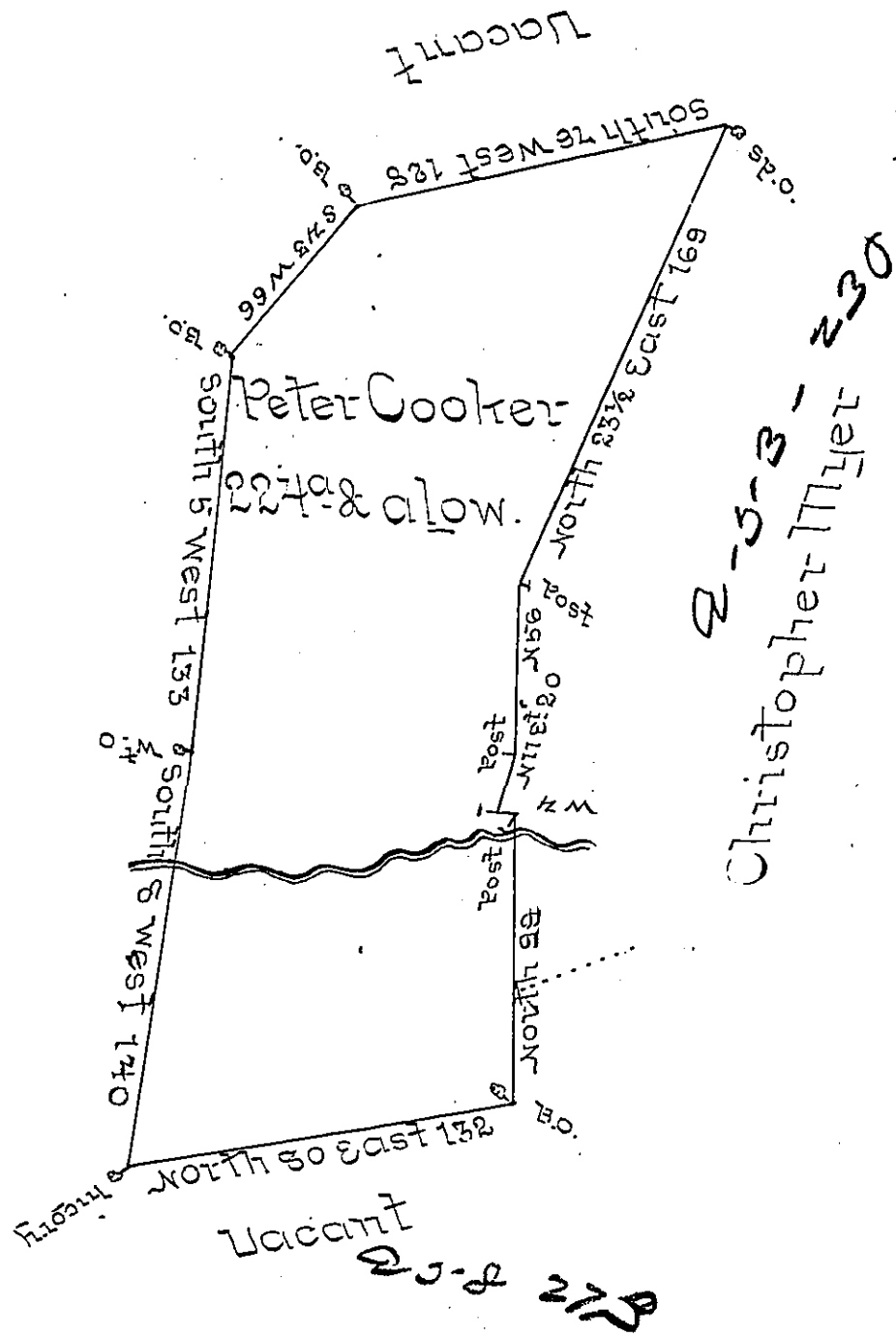

Dom. 1757 Surveyed to Peter Cooker a Tract of Land in The Township of Lebanon Beginning at a Black Oak thence North 99 per to a post thence West 4 per to a post thence North 11 Deg East 20 per to a post thence North 56 per to a post thence North 23 Deg & 1/2 East 169 per to a Spanish oak thence south 76 Deg west 125 per to a Black oak thence south 40 Deg west 66 per to a Black Oak thence south 5 Deg west 133 per to a white oak thence south 8 Deg west 140 per to a hickory thence North 50 Deg East 132 perches to the place of Beginning Containing Two Hundred twenty four acres of Land with the usual Allowance of six acres Percent for Roads &c Surveyed February the 25<sup>th</sup> Anno. Dom: 1758/9
