Wass Survey by Virtue of a Warrant Dated the Twenty Seventh day of April 1786 in the Name of Philip Hock Containing Twenty acres and 120 perches and the allowance of six p. cent. The other B. part of a larger Tract Originally Surveyed to George Koons by Virtue of a Warrant dated the Nineteenth day of April 1749. Then in Philadelphia County now Berks Containing fifty two acres and 95 perches and the allowance of six p. cent. the whole is Conveyed to Philip Hock as it will appear by his conveyances Containing in the whole Seventy three acres and 15 perches and the allowance of six p. cent. This 24th day of May 1786 the bearer agree to pay the office fees.
