The above Described tract of Land was surveyed in the year 1710 by order from the Prop<sup>rs</sup> Com<sup>rs</sup>

James Dawson having Assigned the above described Land to Jacob Ashleman in pursuance of a Warr<sup>t</sup> from the Proprietaries dated ye 14<sup>th</sup> of ye 3<sup>d</sup> mo: Anno Dom 1734. I have Returned the same for Jacob Ashlem<sup>t</sup> into the Secretary's Office the 14<sup>th</sup> of ye 3<sup>d</sup> mo: 1734 - B. G.
