



Draught of a Tract of Land in Donegal Township in Lancaster County Surveyed to James Cook Beginning at a post a Corner of David McClures Land thence North East by North 106 per to a Black Oak thence North 70 deg west 159 per to a hickory thence North 52 deg West 97 per to a Black Oak thence South West by South 134 per to a hickory thence South East by East 12 per to a white oak thence South 6 deg West 116 per to a Black Oak thence South East by East 12 per to a Black Oak thence North East by North 18 per to a hickory thence North 84 deg East 225 per to the place of Beginning Containing Two Hundred forty two acres with the allowance of Six p. Cent for Roads &c.
