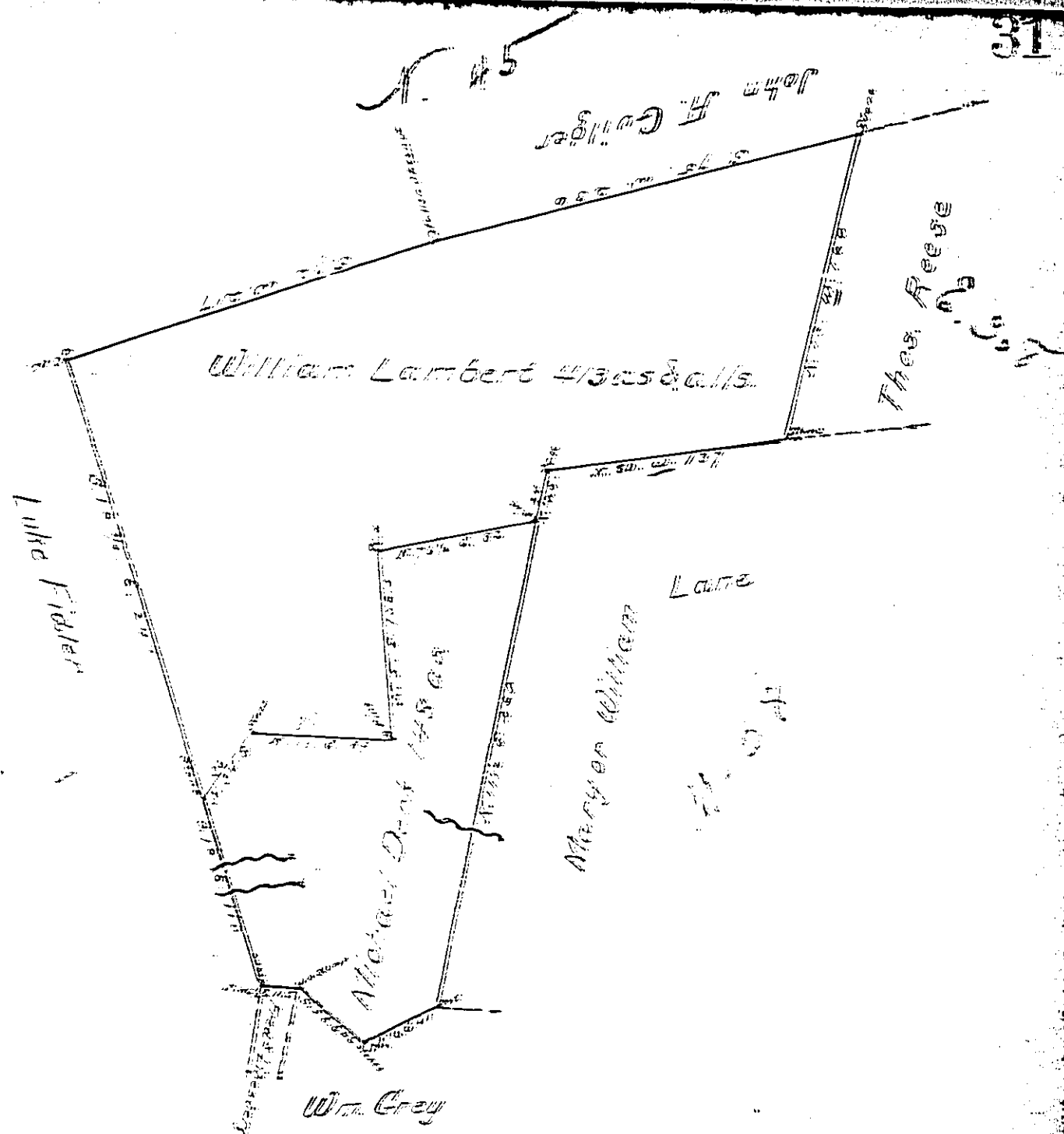

To Gabriel Heister Esq. Successor General. To the land above stated was received to Michael Dent on the 16th June 1829 by virtue of his warrant dated the 22nd August 1789. (as also there was an improvement made in 1797 on the part surveyed to Mr. Dent) it does appear that said survey is a part of what was returned by Wm. Gray then D.S. to Wm. Lambert. I did not find that this was an actual survey made for Lambert by any authority from the land dept. previous to the one made as above stated by virtue of the order granted to Hallie &c. Wm. Laird D.S.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this 11th day of August 1900
