



In Pursuance of an Order from the Commissioner of Property dated the 16<sup>th</sup> day of June 1872 a survey was made on the 3<sup>d</sup> day of July following on a certain Lot of Ground in the Town of Dunbury in the County of Northumberland for John Freeman marked in a General Plan of said Town Number Two hundred and thirty two containing in Breadth East and West on the South side of Blackberry Street sixty feet, and in Length North and South on the East side of Center Alley Two hundred and thirty feet bounded Northward by Blackberry Street, Eastward by Lot Number Two hundred and thirty one, Southward by Gooseberry Alley, and Westward by Center Alley  
 Returned into the Secretary's Office the 31<sup>st</sup> day of May 1874 for John Freeman by Warrant dated 27<sup>th</sup> May 1874

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this seventh day of November 1899.
