A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Little Britain Township in the County of Lancaster containing thirty five acres and one hundred and fifty two perches and the usual allowance of six per cent for roads &c. including about five acres and three quarters of an acre surveyed in pursuance of a Warrant dated the 23<sup>rd</sup> of February Anno Domini 1743 granted unto James Bradley and about thirty acres and thirty two perches is part of several other tracts of land surveyed unto Henry Parsons in pursuance of several Warrants, the one dated the 20<sup>th</sup> of March AD 1743 and the other dated the 10<sup>th</sup> of February AD 1756. Surveyed the 19<sup>th</sup> day of June 1809 for Vincent Stubbs
