Surveyed <sup>March 4, 1785</sup> for Thomas Dree on a Virginia Certificate as follows viz: To the Comy. for Adjusting Claims to unpatented Land in the Counties of Accomack, Galena, Hogania & Ohio do hereby Certify that Thomas Dree Ass<sup>t</sup> of Thomas Hughes is entitled to two Hundred & fifty Acres of Land in Accomack County on Seneca Creek to include his Settlement made in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & seventy two

Given under our hands at Coxes Fort the twentieth day of Jan<sup>r</sup> 1780 in the fourth year of the Commonwealth
