



By virtue of a Warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries bearing date the thirtieth day of March Anno Dom<sup>ini</sup> 1738. I have surveyed and laid <sup>out</sup> unto Thomas Cox part of an Island in <sup>River</sup> Susquehanna, containing One hundred and eighty ~~acres~~ six acres with the allowance of six p. cent. Bounded as followeth, Begins at a Maple Tree by the <sup>S.</sup> river, then south sixty nine degrees west-ly one hundred and twenty perches to an Inlet<sup>t</sup> Down the <sup>S.</sup> Inlet<sup>t</sup> about a mile to the lower point of the Island, Thence up the <sup>S.</sup> river near about another mile to the place of beginning, Survey'd June 16<sup>th</sup>
