



The above described Land situated in Heddleberg Township in the County of Lancaster was surveyed for Frederick Capps viz<sup>t</sup> the 215 acres by the usual allow-  
 and of 6<sup>th</sup> p Cent for Roads Gen<sup>al</sup> was surveyed the 4<sup>th</sup> day of July 1737, in  
 pursuance of a warrant dated the 8<sup>th</sup> day of June 1737, and the said Frederick  
 hath since assigned his right to 107 acres thereof to his brother Andreas  
 Capps. The adjoining 40 acres by the like allowance was surveyed for the  
 said Frederick Capps in pursuance of a Warrant dated the 28<sup>th</sup> day of  
 September 1738. the 10<sup>th</sup> of January 1744
