E. W. by 2<sup>d</sup> same 85 ps to a white oak, Thence N 65 W. by John Graham, 37 per to a white oak, Thence W by S. 40 per to a white oak, Thence W. by N. both by S. Graham 57 per to the place of beginning, Containing Two hundred and thirteen acres. Beside the usual allowance of six ps. Chap.
