In order to correct the errors of the former survey, and as well to avoid interference, on the 25th - I did by the draught of Arnold (which I had not before) I have adjusted what was lacking of the former survey "Viz" Corrected the error, and conformed the present to the lines of Arnold, before mentioned - in pursuing the former lines, adhering to the lines of Arnold when intersected with, and including a very small triangle at S. for sake of regularity. I find ^{of} 151^{1/2} acres contained, 6^{1/2} acres surplus beyond instructions. The owner pleads his having peaceably enjoyed it for so long a time, and alleges that on statement of circumstances patent will be granted including the excess.
