



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the fourteenth day of August 1734 Surveyed unto John Holder a tract of Land Situate in Mase-tawny in the County of Philada. Beginning at a post in a line of Michael Millers Land thence by the same North eighty degrees East ninety three perches and by Vacant Land the same Course twenty perches to a large White Oak thence by Vacant Land south ten degrees East one hundred and fifty one perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South Eighty degrees West one hundred and thir-teen perches to a Corner stone thence by Vacant Land North ten de-grees West one hundred and fifty one perches to the place of Be-ginning Containing one hundred acres with the usual allow-ance of Six pcent.
