



By Virtue of a warrant from ye Proprietor dated ye 12th of the 6th month Anno Dom 1740 The above described Tract of Land was surveyed unto Richard Treveler in Fallowfield Chester County Beginning at a White Oak at a corner of the Land of William Harlan Then East Nor East by Vacant Land 32 perches to a Black Oak Thence by the Land of Joseph Powell the three following courses North North west 16 perches to a white oak North 60 degrees East 82 perches to a white oak, thence North Nor East 170 perches to a white oak, thence north 30 degrees west 125 perches to a stone By Vacant Land Thence South 85 degs west by Vacant Land 90 perches to a Black oak then South by west by Vacant Land and the Land of Albert Shear 104 perches to a post, then North 60 degrees west by Vacant Land 40 perches to a Black Oak, then ^{west west} west by the same 14 perches to a Greenut in William Harlan's line, then S E on the same 20 perches to a Black oak, thence west south west by the sd. Harlan's Land 34 perches to a Black oak, thence South South East by the same 220 perches to the Place of Beginning Containing Two hundred & Seventy Six acres beside ye usual allowances.
