



In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 28th day of March Anno Dom 1735 Survey'd unto Jacob Taylor on the 3d day of June then next ensuing a certain Tract of Land situate on a small branch of Doe Run in the Township of Macclough in Chester County Beginning at a black oak at a corner of John Taylor's land thence west by the land late of Thomas Nixon 220 ps. to a Black oak thence north east by east by the land of James Dyer Torrans Owen and Robert Gabby 310 pches to a post thence east by the land of ~~James~~ Joseph Baker fifteen pches to a post thence by the land of the sd. John Taylor south forty five pches to a post and south south west 138 pches to the place of Beginning containing one Hundred & twenty eight acres and the usual allowance for Roads.
