



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Twenty sixth day of February, 1733. Surveyed unto Francis Rutter a tract of land, situated in ^{Exeter} Oley in the County of Philadelphia. Beginning at a Spanish Oak a Corner of his other Land thence by the same Northwest one hundred and ten perches and by Land of George Rutter one hundred and ninety perches and by Vacant Land the same course fifty three perches to a Corner stone, thence North East by Vacant Land seventy perches to a Corner stone, thence by Vacant Land South East one hundred and sixty perches to a Black Oak in the line of Rudolph Hartzler's land thence by the same South West forty perches to a post, thence by ^{of} Rudolph Hartzler Land South East one hundred and ninety three perches to a post, ~~the~~ being a corner of Peter Furnewells Land, thence by the same South West thirty perches to the place of Beginning. Containing One hundred acres with the allowance of six p. bench.
