By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the fourth day of May 1734. Surveyed unto Evan Thomas a tract of Land Situate in Hill town in the County of Bucks. Beginning at a Black Oak a corner of his <sup>Father's</sup> Land <sup>Said</sup> Evan Thomas, thence by land of Bartholomew Young S. E. forty one perches and by land of John Lewis the same course one hundred and eighteen perches to a post in a line of William James's land, thence by the same South West sixty one perches to a Spanish Oak crown down, thence by land of Evan Thomas Jun<sup>r</sup> North west thirty nine perches and by land of Owen Evans of same course one hundred and twenty perches to a post, thence by his Father Evan Thomas's Land North East sixty one perches to the place of Beginning, Containing fifty seven Acres with the usual allowance of six <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> Cent
