



The above is the Draught of a Tract of Land called Chestnut Level, Situate on the waters of Chest creek, about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile N.E. of the old Trading path, in Cumberland County; Adjoining Lands Surveyed for Alex. Barclay, John Kelson and Alex. Murray; containing three hundred and ten acres and one half, and the usual Allowance of six ft. Cent for Roads by Survey the 1st Day of July A.D. 1769, for Charles Gault, in pursuance of an Order No. 42 Dated the 3rd Day of April 1769.
