



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Dated the third day of June 1734 Surveyed unto John Bartolet a tract of land situate in Oley in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup> Beginning at a post in the line of John Shires land thence by the same North twenty degrees East one hundred and fifty eight perches to a post thence by Vacant Land North seventy Degrees West two hundred and ~~two~~<sup>thirty</sup> perches to a Black Oak thence by Vacant Land South twenty five Degrees West one hundred and fifty eight perches to a whickery thence by Land of Thomas Ellis South seventy Degrees East two hundred and forty four perches to the place of Beginning Containing two hundred and twenty acres with the usual allotment of Six p. Cent - Surveyed July 12<sup>th</sup> 1733
