To ^{the} one hundred and fifty five 1/2 acres contained within the dotted lines was surveyed to Oliver Duff. In Pursuance of a warrant dated September 15th 1785, being part of 255 1/4 acres which is returned into the Surveyor General's Office, in Pursuance of a warrant, is now claimed by William Elliott in Pursuance of the above Application - The reason Duff's warrant was executed on Wm Elliott's Claim was owing to his ^{old} boundary being at that time circumscribed, but never calculated, and was bounded on his lines
