



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Dated the Thirty first day of August 1734 Surveyed unto Richard Gregory a Tract of Land situate between Macongie and Newcowissehoppin in the County of Philad^a Beginning at a Chesnut a Corner of his other Land thence by Vacant land South East one hundred perches to a post thence by Vacant land South forty degrees West two hundred twenty nine perches to a Stone thence by Vacant land North fifty Degrees West two hundred perches to a post thence by Vacant land South forty Degrees West one hundred perches to a Spanish Oak thence by Vacant land North fifty Degrees West one hundred forty perches to a Spanish Oak thence by Vacant land North forty Degrees East one hundred fifty Seven perches to a White oak thence by Vacant land South fifty Degrees East one hundred thirty six perches and by land of s^d Richard Gregory one hundred & four perches to a White Oak thence by said Gregory's land North forty degrees East one hundred Eighty perches to the place of Beginning Containing ~~three~~ ~~three~~ ~~hundred~~ ~~acres~~ with the usual Allowance of Six Percent - Surveyed Novem^r 20th 1734
