



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the fourth day of September 1734 surveyed unto Christian Taylor a tract of Land situate in Frederick Township in the County of Philadelphia Beginning at a Black Oak a Corner of John Johnsons Land thence by the same North East one hundred and twenty three perches and by Vacant Land forty five perches to a post in a line of Adam Heill's Land thence by the same South East forty seven perches to a post thence by Land of Jacob Haux South West twenty four perches to a post thence by said Haux Land and Land of Jacob Hechlin South Seven degrees West one hundred & seventy four perches to a post in a line of Humphrey Hauxy and John Budds Land thence by the same North West one hundred and forty seven perches to the place of Beginning Containing Eighty Seven acres with the usual Allowance of six per cent
